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Concert & Performance Expectations

All music students perform in formal concerts during the school year fulfilling many of the Music Curricular Competencies in the process leading up, during, and after the event. In addition, students may be called upon to perform in various school and community functions such as assemblies, informal concerts, and pop-up events.

Students are required to assist with set-up **before** and tear down **after** a concert. Many hands make for light work. After concerts we must return our rehearsal and performance areas to their pre-concert state – or better! (just like hiking or camping (2))

- Students are to be in full uniform for all performances unless otherwise stated.
- Students are required to be at all performances unless suddenly taken ill or excused in advance. Students absent due to illness or special circumstances are required to provide Ms. Livingstone with and email or signed note from the parent or guardian. When a scheduling conflict arises, please provide at least two weeks notice or if dates of tournaments, meets, recitals are already known, please provide Ms. Livingstone that information by October 1st or as soon as you learn the date. We are a 'team' and each 'player' is required for a successful performance.

'Homework' in Band

Regular home practice is *essential* to achieving success in music. I recommend that students make the commitment of short chunks of music practice in your regular routine for maximum results! We will be talking about Goal Setting and Reflections in each grade. Parent/Guardians, you can expect to see these student documents twice a term as you are part of this process. Assignment Due Dates

Students are responsible for handing in all work in a timely manner. Unless otherwise requested, assignments will be handed into the appropriate grade box at the front of the room. Some assignments will require online submission (MyEdBC, Breezin' Thru Theory, Music Dept Website)

Music Department Uniforms

Uniforms are to be worn for all performances unless otherwise indicated. Through your hard work, you have earned the right to wear a music uniform, so please keep your uniform, neat, clean, tidy, and wear it with pride! Uniforms are not to be left in your locker, someone else's locker, or in the band room. Take care of it! Remember that Thrift Stores are good place to look for uniform pieces such as black pants and black dress shoes.

Music Department Tie (Gr.9-12)

*jeans/leggings/yoga-pants are <u>not</u> acceptable uniform bottoms *pant length must be to the ankle * no rips/tears/designs/patterns

Materials

Students are to come to all classes with the following items (see course outlines)

- pencil with eraser! instrument in working condition
- music & music book IN folder (both provided) extra reeds, valve oil, cleaning swab

Reeds

If students need a reed during class, payment must be received by the end of the following class. School Reed Price Guide: Clarinet \$2.50, Alto Sax \$3.50, Tenor \$3.75, Bari/Bass Clarinet \$4.50 It is <u>highly recommended</u> that you purchase a few reeds at a time - preferably a box from a music store – so that you have a spare on hand when one accidentally breaks. Reeds could last you about a month given regular practice but MUST be changed when they crack, chip, or get mouldy (eww!) Strengths 2 ½, 3, 3 ½ are most commonly used. Beginner clarinettists may start on a strength 2 but will quickly move to a 2 ½ strength. Beginner saxophones will start on a 2 ½ strength.

<u>Please do NOT purchase a Plastic Reed without talking with Ms. Livingstone!</u> <u>These are for advanced players in very specialized circumstances only!</u>

See me for information about double reeds (bassoon/oboe) or if you have questions. Preferred Reed Brands: Juno or Vandoren (Traditional or V21).



All Students: Label Your Instruments!

All instruments – school, personal, or store rental – are to be labelled on both sides of the case with the following information:

First and Last Name, Grade, School, City, Province i.e. Regan Livingstone, Grade 21, G.P. Vanier, Courtenay, BC Use masking tape and a sharpie for clear and quick identification, not just a luggage tag!

Cell Phones & Other Portable Electronic Devices

Mobile and connected Bluetooth devices are to remain OFF during rehearsals and are not permitted to be with the student during class time. A storage unit is available for students to store their phone if they do not have a backpack to store it in during class time. This is also helpful during emergency procedures when cell phone use can add to confusion. (i.e. Lock Down Procedures)

Jazz Band - Grades 9-12 (First rehearsal is Tuesday, September 19th at 7:30 am!)

Rehearsals are held twice a week in the band room <u>starting</u> at 7:30 a.m. These means that your instrument is set up and you are ready to begin rehearsal at 7:30 a.m. Jazz Band is open to all music students in Grades 9 through 12. The traditional jazz instrumentation includes Saxophones, Trumpets, Trombones, Piano, Bass, Guitar, Drum Kit, and Percussion but this does not mean that other instruments are not welcome. Please see me if you wish to be in the Jazz Band but do not play one of these instruments – we will make sure there is a place for you!

Instrument Rental & Head Start Nights (Sept 20 & 21, 2023)

Band 8 and Beginning Band 10 will receive additional handouts about instrument selection and rentals. These will also be on the Music Department website. Students who are not beginners can order their instruments online through Tapestry Music or Long & McQuade or rent from Vanier. School instruments are available to rent for \$100/year but selection. Online rental order from the stores are encouraged, HOWEVER, if you are Beginning Band Student please wait for further direction before you decide to order an instrument online. Also, new students will be eager to put their instrument together as soon as it is received...H OWEVER...to avoid accidental damage, resist this urge!



Vanier Music Parents Association (VMPA)

A successful music program is only possible with support. This is a wonderful opportunity to help make your child's experience in music a terrific one. Any interested parent, guardian, grandparent, aunt or uncle, or friend who wishes to get involved with the music department, please send me an email or have your student return the attached form to me at school. We always need drivers! The school must update our files each year so a CRC (Criminal Record Check) and Driver's Abstract will be needed for this school year even if you completed one last year. More details will be communicated with those who want to help with driving and/or chaperone duties.



We have a VMPA meeting at least once before our winter concert! Topics will include concert set up/fundraisers, travel and other opportunities for our students!

The VMPA has a bursary that is awarded annually to a deserving graduate of the music department who will be pursuing music studies at a post-secondary institution either 1-2 years after high school graduation. As the music teacher, I am not involved with this process.
